
DARLENE YESKE


What a great opportunity for us to showcase TFAM and fibre art. The feedback was amazing!


There were 35 fibre art pieces and over 70 postcards submitted to round out a stunning exhibit which introduced many onlookers to fibre as an amazing art form.

The range of techniques included: 3D, Structural, Freeform Crochet, Themed, Felting, Pixelated, Abstract, Woven and Tributary to mention just a few.





The sale of the postcards, as a fundraiser for the Ukrainian Canadian Foundation was also very successful. They were \$25 each, with proceeds being donated - over \$600 was raised. 


Delights Exhibition Statement GRAND NATIONAL
