As summer slowly draws to a close, it is certainly a sunny consolation to look forward to the start of fall and the TFAM programming year. I hope that you have had a great summer, whether you were able to focus on your art, or just the extraordinary fact of summer here on the prairies. I stitched my way through the last few months, learning all about the beauty and utility of creative mending, and hand stitching my ode to the matriarchy (in response to Barbiemania of course).

TFAM's first virtual meet-up of the year will be on Tuesday, September 19th at 6:00 pm. We now have 80 members! As there are many who are new to our organization, this will be a good time for us to get to know or reacquaint ourselves with one another. We will also be reviewing the various ways that we connect as fibre friends, through our website, social media, and virtual and in-person get togethers. Be sure to join us, and also submit some photos to our monthly show and share. It can be a recently completed work, a work in progress or a piece that needs some feedback. We love seeing what you are up to in your studios.

Also in September, our two pods will begin meeting again. The In Stitches pod, moderated by Theresa Shaw, will resume monthly meetings on September 5th at 2:00 pm, and each first Tuesday of the month through the rest of the year. We will be meeting via Zoom to chat about hand stitching - what we do, how we do it, and what it means to us ..... An email invite will be sent out to all members about a week before the meet-up.

The Felting pod will be hosted by Rosalind Sims and will begin meeting on Monday, September 11th at 7:00 pm. Members of that group will determine how and when the group will gather throughout the coming year. An email invitation will be sent out to all members about a week ahead of that date. Coming up in October we will have our first Fall Retreat and Annual General Meeting (AGM). An update about the retreat is in this newsletter and all the details are also available on our website <u>tfamartists.ca</u>. Because of the retreat and AGM, there will not be a virtual meet-up in October.

In November, our monthly Meet-Up will be held on Tuesday, November 21st at 2:00 pm. We will be joined by Lorraine Roy, a Canadian textile artist, who will give a special presentation about her work, entitled "Call of the Heartwood: my creative journey with trees". Lorraine will present her artistic journey in words and pictures as she describes how trees wove their way into her art and her heart. Lorraine will describe the variety of nontraditional fabric and thread techniques that have evolved over her 35 year career, and will present a slide show of current pieces.

A horticulturalist by training from University of Guelph, Lorraine uses current scientific research in horticulture and forestry as a main inspiration for her framed and quilted artworks. This event will appeal to artists of all stripes, environmentalists, gardeners, and anyone who exalts in the presence of trees.

Lorraine also has an exhibit in this year's World of Threads Festival.

As the holiday season approaches in December, our virtual Meet-Up on Tuesday, December 12th will be a PARTY !!!!! It's becoming a bit of a tradition. Members are invited to dress up, bring a friend, play some games, and have some laughs to brighten up this season of family gatherings and celebration.

#### THE ELEANOR ROSE OUTDOOR QUILT SHOW

(EROQS) is a fabulous event that takes place mid-August each year in Kelwood, MB. It happens in conjunction with the Harvest Sun Music Festival, a Makers Market and a large town auction, so much happening. The show, featuring over 350 quilts, is named in memory of the founder's (Kathy Levandoski) Mom.

I was asked to be the 2023 Featured Fibre Artist and decided on a variety of pieces that follow my creative journey from 2009 to the present day.

My area for display was an alleyway through one of the beautiful gardens. Upper and lower lines of hanging cord allowed for both long and wide pieces.

I included the exhibit I did for the 2020 10th year anniversary of the Cluster New Music Festival, which was never seen due to COVID cancellations. 49 thread portraits of performers from each of the ten years, all 6" x 6". I also included some of my newer work made for an upcoming class I am teaching in Canmore and for the CRAFTED Show and Sale in Winnipeg.

Many different artists and groups of artists are featured at the EROQS. There is a lovely walkway with a shaded canopy of leaves where the featured guilds show their quilts. It is a perfect place to see and experience the beautiful work done by so many groups of like-minded, talented, and creative people.

The other featured group at the EROQS was TFAM! This year, the JOY exhibit was hung by Tania Deleva. Thanks to Tania and several other TFAM volunteers, who sold postcards and answered exhibit questions. We sold seven more unique works of art to very happy customers with all proceeds going to the Ukrainian Canadian Foundation.

Being a part of this outdoor quilt show was an amazing experience! I was able to talk about my work, my inspiration and ideas, the techniques that I love to use, and my fabulous, supportive fibre community to people who work with fibre and textile, as well as those who didn't even know this type of art existed. Before I knew it, the day was done and it was time to load up the car for the drive home.

The Eleanor Rose Outdoor Quilt Show is an annual event that takes place in Kelwood, MB every August. The featured artists for next year are almost all booked and it promises to be another not-to-be-missed event.

### **TFAM Fall Retreat: Harvesting Our Creativity**

We are all looking forward to our first ever TFAM retreat, to be held at Camp Assiniboia on Thursday, October 12th to Sunday, October 15th 2023. There are various options available for participants, from one session or one day only, to the whole enchilada - three days of learning and creative inspiration. If you haven't signed up already, there is still time. Activities are designed to nourish our bodies, minds and spirits.

We will be staying in the main lodge of the camp, which can accommodate everyone in dorm style rooms. There are also some cabins available for those with mobility issues. We will receive three fully catered meals provided for us each day. We will have access to the grounds for walks and other outdoor activities.

The retreat begins with a journal-making session with Krista Zeghers on Thursday evening. There will be two main workshops on the following days - one is a day long exploration of colour using various dyeing techniques with Susan Selby, and one is a day working with wireform to create 3D shapes out of all types of fibre, led by Elaine Filyk and Yvonne Carlson. We will also have a special presentation by Tamara Klassen on her textile travels, and a yoga session focussing on alleviating the aches and stresses of fibre work. The evenings are set aside for member show and share sessions, and meetings in small groups. Participation in each of these activities is included in your registration. There will be time, as well, to work on individual projects, if you choose. The weekend will end with our annual general meeting (AGM) on Sunday afternoon. All members of TFAM are invited to join us for the AGM, whether they attend the retreat or not.

One of the benefits of a gathering such as this is the opportunity to share information and ideas with likeminded individuals. As fibre people we all have more knowledge than we may realize, as well as a passion for the artistic form. We are excited by the prospect of sharing and learning with all of you and hope that you will gather with us to "harvest our creativity" this fall.



On September 8 and 9, join the Textile and Fibre Artists of Manitoba as they feature fibre artist Rosemarie Peloquin at the Manitoba Fibre Festival at Red River Exhibition Place.

Franco-Manitoban fibre artist, Rosemarie Péloquin, is well known in the fibre art world. She uses her hands and the medium of wool to sculpt with barbed needles to create a myriad of portraits and sculptures that are most endearing. The facial expressions she crafts are all so detailed that you instantly feel a connection as if they are an old friend.

Rosemarie is a needle felting artist residing in Ste. Rose-du-Lac, Manitoba. There she works on her creations, allowing herself to be guided by the materials, pushing and pulling the small barbed wands and teasing the fibres into denser folds. She embraces each piece as they reveal their personality to her.

In 2020 she was commissioned by Campaign For Wool Canada to create a bust of their patron, HRH The Prince of Wales (now King Charles), to celebrate 10 years of the global Campaign for Wool. She also presented the bust of Queen Elizabeth - what an honour that must have been!

Come see her work and listen to her as she shares her love of wool, her inspirations and her experiences.

### **RADICAL STITCH**

### ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT EXHIBITIONS OF CONTEMPORARY INDIGENOUS BEADING ACROSS NORTH AMERICA EVER PRESENTED.

Beading is one of the defining mediums of contemporary Indigenous art on this continent, and this landmark exhibition will bring much needed critical attention to the breadth and impact of this practice.

Radical Stitch looks at the contemporary and transformative context of beading through the aesthetic innovations of artists and the tactile beauty of beads. Beading materials and techniques are rooted in both culturally informed traditions and cultural adaptation, and function as a place of encounter, knowledge transfer, and acts of resistance. Connecting to a tradition of making, exercised over thousands of years, this skill-based practice ties one artist to another, past to present and beyond. The exhibition includes a range of work from the customary to the contemporary, with a variety of approaches, concepts, and purposes. Gathering together top artists from across North America/ Turtle Island, the selected pieces exemplify current and future directions of some of the most exciting and impressive practices. The works in Radical Stitch invite viewers to immerse themselves in the political, creative, and aesthetic dimensions of beadwork.

## World of Threads

#### October 10 – December 17, 2023

After a long hiatus, The World of Threads Festival is booked for Fall of 2023 in Oakville, Ontario, Canada. This unique festival opens on October 10 and runs until December 17, 2023 with an Opening Reception on Saturday, October 14, 2023.



World of Threads is one of the most vibrant fibre arts festivals in the world where contemporary fibre and textile art are showcased in all forms. The last festival, pre-COVID, featured 303 artworks by 65 artists from Canada, Denmark, England, Hungary, Netherlands, Norway, Russia and USA. The festival was a huge success with attendance of over 60,000 who came out to see the show.

Something that's different about World of Threads is that the curators let the art guide them. Festival Curators Gareth Bate and Dawne Rudman don't have predetermined curatorial ideas or impose their concepts on the artists. Each new festival is a blank slate and shows develop entirely out of the submissions received. To find their main exhibitions, connections and common themes between the thousands of submitted artworks are what ultimately decide which pieces are accepted. <u>www.worldofthreadsfestival.com</u>


